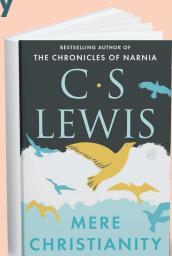




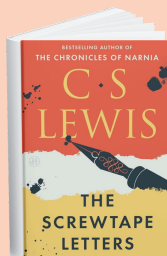
BOOKS WE'RE LOVING THIS SUMMER

ABOUT THESE BOOKS...

Mere Christianity

A classic and thoughtful exploration of the Christian faith from one of Christianity's most beloved writers. Deep without being overly academic.

Best for: Women who enjoy thoughtful discussion, apologetics, or want a stronger foundation for what they believe

Audiobook friendly? Yes – excellent on audio

Book club discussion idea: What argument or chapter challenged you most?

The Screwtape Letters

A clever fictional look at spiritual warfare through imagined letters from a senior demon to a younger one. Insightful, convicting, and interesting.

Best for: Women who enjoy fiction with depth and spiritual reflection

Audiobook friendly? Very much so

Book club discussion idea: Which spiritual distractions felt most relatable in modern life?

Seeking Allah, Finding Jesus

A powerful testimony of one man's journey from Islam to Christianity, filled with compassion, honesty, and conviction.

Best for: Women interested in testimony stories, apologetics, or understanding other faith backgrounds

Audiobook friendly? Excellent on audio

Book club discussion idea: What role did friendship and hospitality play in Nabeel's story?

Confronting Christianity

Addresses common questions and objections about Christianity with warmth, intelligence, and biblical truth.

Best for: Women navigating hard questions or wanting confidence in conversations about faith

Audiobook friendly? Yes

Book club discussion idea: Which objection to Christianity do you hear most often today?

Jesus Through the Eyes of Women

A beautiful look at how Jesus elevated, valued, and transformed the lives of women throughout Scripture.

Best for: Women wanting encouragement and deeper understanding of Jesus' heart for women

Audiobook friendly? Yes

Book club discussion idea: Which biblical woman's story impacted you most?

Idols of the Heart

A practical and biblical look at the hidden idols we often place above God – comfort, approval, control, success, and more.

Best for: Women seeking spiritual growth and heart-level reflection

Audiobook friendly? Better in print for journaling/highlighting, but audio works too

Book club discussion idea: What "heart idols" are easiest to excuse in our culture?



Glass Across the Sea

A fantasy adventure full of wonder, identity, courage, and redemption themes. Perfect for readers who enjoy imaginative stories with heart and deeper meaning. Also a fun option for moms, daughters, tweens, and teens to enjoy together.

Best for: Fiction lovers, moms reading alongside older kids/teens, fans of fantasy and fairy-tale style storytelling

Audiobook friendly? Yes — immersive and engaging

Book club discussion idea: How do stories and imagination sometimes help us better understand truth, identity, and hope?

The Wingfeather Saga

A beautifully written fantasy series full of adventure, sacrifice, courage, and redemption themes. Great for moms reading alongside older kids or teens too.

Best for: Fiction lovers, moms reading with tweens/teens, fans of Narnia-style storytelling

Audiobook friendly? Wonderful family listening option

Book club discussion idea: How does fantasy sometimes help us see spiritual truths more clearly?

The Hiding Place

The incredible true story of Corrie ten Boom and her family helping hide Jews during WWII — a moving testimony of faith, forgiveness, and courage.

Best for: Women who love biographies and strong faith stories

Audiobook friendly? Yes

Book club discussion idea: What does forgiveness look like when it feels impossible?

The Ballot and the Bible

A thoughtful and balanced look at how Christians can engage politics faithfully without letting political identity become more important than allegiance to Jesus. Gracious, biblically grounded, and discussion-friendly.

Best for: Women interested in faith and culture conversations, current issues, or thoughtful discipleship

Audiobook friendly? Yes — very conversational in tone

Book club discussion idea: How do we stay politically engaged without allowing politics to shape our identity more than Scripture?

Nobody's Mother: Artemis of the Ephesians in Antiquity and the New Testament

A fascinating blend of biblical scholarship, church history, and personal reflection exploring the cultural background behind 1 Timothy and the worship of Artemis in Ephesus. Sandra helps readers better understand difficult passages about women through careful historical context and faithful biblical interpretation.

Best for: Women who enjoy deeper Bible study, historical context, theology, or studying difficult passages thoughtfully

Audiobook friendly? Yes — especially good for women who enjoy learning through podcasts or lectures

Book club discussion idea: How does understanding historical and cultural context help us read Scripture more faithfully?
