




# **Core Truth: God gives GENTLENESS!**

Scripture: "Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near." Philippians 4:5

Let's start by talking about what gentleness is.



Gentleness is a characteristic of someone or something that shows kindness and consideration. In this verse, it is referring to being fair and mild.

This verse is telling us to be gentle to others (kind and considerate) and to let that gentleness be evident to all. For it to be evident to all means to let everyone see and experience your gentleness.

Let this verse be an encouragement to be gentle towards ALL- friends, family, coworkers, people you like, and even people you do not. We are called to be gentle to all. We know we can accomplish this because the Holy Spirit will equip us with gentleness, the same gentleness we are called to show in Philippians 4:5.



#### **Gentleness**



In just the last few weeks, I have had the opportunity to celebrate with several friends who have birthed new babies or whose children have given them new grandchildren. I always love seeing the photos and videos of the first meeting of parents and newborns...there are few things more precious.

I especially love first time dads, who are big and strong, but who tremble at the thought of holding their tiny human in their arms for the first time. They quickly realize that a firm, but tender, touch is what they need to be successful. Babies require gentleness for sure.

But what happens as children grow? True, they become physically stronger, some tough as nails, as they tumble when learning to walk and scratch knees and elbows as they play. Galatians 6:1


The Lord's slave must not quarrel, but must be gentle to everyone, able to teach, and patient.
