Core Truth: God gives FAITHFULNESS!

Scripture: "His master replied, 'Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness!' Matthew 25:21

faithfulness

Faithfulness occurs when someone acts in full obedience, trust, and belief in God that He will do what He says He will do. This sometimes involves believing in things that you may not be able to see or you may not have all the answers to.

The verse comes from a story in Matthew where the master gives his servants talents to look after while he is away. Two of the servants took what their master gave them and made more with it. One of the servants buried the talent and did nothing and it made the master angry. To the servants that made more of their portion the master was pleased. "Well done, my good and faithful servant." In life, God is our Master and we are to be faithful servants. This story tells us what happens when someone is a good and faithful servant- they are rewarded. If we are faithful to God with a few things, He will trust us with many things and we will be able to share in our Master's (God's) happiness.

Faithfulness is provided to us by the Holy Spirit. Through the Holy Spirit, we can have the kind of faithfulness that the Master desires in Matthew 25.

Cultivate Faithfulness

Dwell in the land and cultivate faithfulness.

When we choose to follow Christ, faithfulness does not magically appear. Oh yes, there is a certain measure of faith that is granted to us by the generosity and grace of our good and loving God through Jesus Christ. But faithfulness is like the produce of the garden. It starts with the seed. Before the seed is placed in the ground, there is backbreaking dirty and exhausting labor put forth to prepare a place for the seed to grow. The weeds have

to be cleared, rocks removed, hard packed earth broken up, and rich nutrients added to the soil.

In a healthy garden, there is ongoing work of cultivation that the seed will grow into a strong plant and bear fruit. If

Even before our profession of belief, God is preparing the soil of our heart to receive the seed of faith that will grow and thrive. He uses life experiences and others around us to do the labor. Once our faith is planted, he allows trials and tribulation to stress the roots of our faith eventually

making it stronger. The cultivation of faithfulness is a lifelong process—at times arduous and painful, at others, effortless. In the mysterious balance between our labor to dwell, delight, commit, trust and God's hand to bring forth our righteousness, the fruit of the harvest is abundant and beautiful to behold.
